I frequently get calls in the Code Enforcement Office about property disputes. "Is my neighbor allowed to do ...?" "Can I put up a fence?" "How far off the property line should it be?"

Fences are regulated in Article 1309 of the Codified Ordinances of Titusville Section 1309.04. The statute can be very easily explained with a few guidelines.

- 1. Fences **DO** require a building permit
- 2. Always call 811 before you dig to have underground utilities marked
- 3. Fences in the front yard cannot exceed 3' 6" in height
- 4. Fences at the rear and side yards cannot exceed 6' in height
- 5. Fences in a side yard within 5 feet of a driveway and 15 feet from the front property line cannot exceed 3'6" to allow residents and guests to see traffic
- 6. There is no restriction of how close to the property line you may build your fence but here are some good recommendations.
  - a. Survey your property. Know where the line is.
  - b. It is a good rule of thumb to build 12 to 24 inches off the property line. This will allow you space to perform maintenance, run a mower, or trim weeds without going on your neighbor's property.
  - c. If you choose to build right up to the line, you need to be aware that if your neighbor denies you access to their property you will not be able to perform maintenance on your fence without taking it down.






